

Investment objective

The Company’s investment objectives are to achieve a high, secure dividend yield on its investment portfolio and to realise long-term growth in the capital value of the portfolio for the benefit of shareholders while taking care to preserve Shareholders’ capital.

Manager’s comments

The Company’s NAV total return was -2.5% in May, compared with -1.7% for the S&P Global Infrastructure Index in Sterling total return terms, while the share price total return was -1.1%. Calendar year-to-date, the NAV total return was 8.5% versus 8.0% for the reference index, and the share price total return was 20.1%. The shares continued to trade at a small premium to NAV across the month. The portfolio finished May with gearing of 11.5%, down slightly from April but still reflecting a high level of conviction in the portfolio.

The market backdrop was less supportive than in April, with higher developed markets’ bond yields weighing on listed utilities and infrastructure, particularly the more interest-rate-sensitive parts of the market. Regulated Utilities overall were weak, contributing -1.3%, while the US and UK were the largest country detractors, contributing -1.4% and -1.0% over the month respectively. Absolute performance was also held back primarily by Electric Utilities, which contributed -1.8%.

The latter were particularly influenced by the announcement of a large-scale merger between NextEra Energy and Dominion in the US. The combination is expected to create a giant c.\$250bn market cap group. NextEra’s share price reacted negatively, while Dominion rallied on the news. The net impact of both holdings was negative over the month though, and NextEra was the portfolio’s largest negative contributor (-0.5%).

UK utilities were weak also, due to political uncertainty and rising interest rates. National Grid, SSE, Drax and Pennon were among the largest detractors to performance. Only Greencoat UK Wind performed well as the stock continues its rerating triggered by Engie’s acquisition of UK Power Networks in February 2026 for a c.50% premium to Regulated Asset Base.

The portfolio’s best contributor was Brookfield Renewable Partners, with a 0.4% contribution. It is also worth noting the positive contribution from the airport segment, with Italy’s ENAV, Zurich Airport and Spain’s Aena among the best performers, generating a combined positive contribution of 0.6%.

Portfolio activity during May was focused on selective additions to existing holdings rather than broad repositioning. The largest increases were in Aena, Iberdrola, China Water Affairs, Greencoat UK Wind and Flughafen Zurich, while positions in BKW, ENGIE and Williams were reduced. The portfolio ended the month with its largest sector exposures in Electric Utilities at 38.4% and Multi-Utilities at 27.7%, alongside meaningful positions in Airport Services, Water Utilities and Renewable Electricity, reflecting continued emphasis on regulated and integrated utility businesses and selective infrastructure assets where earnings visibility and long-term capital investment remain attractive.

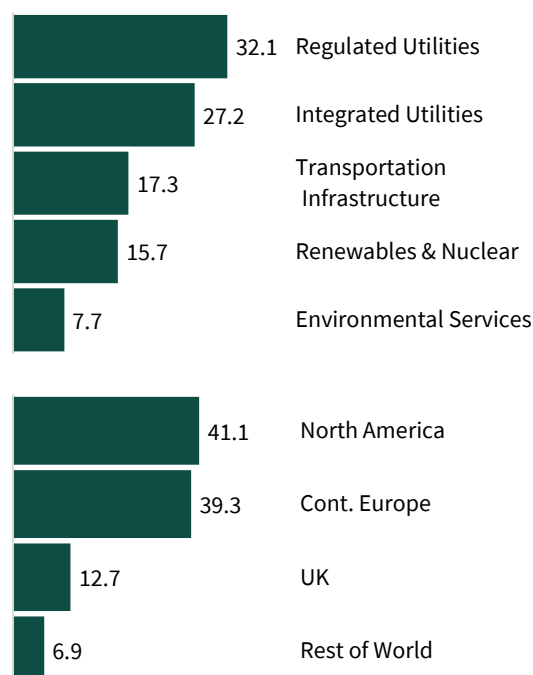
